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# Executive Summary

The National Association of State Student Grant and Aid Programs (NASSGAP) is pleased to present its 32<sup>nd</sup> Annual Survey Report of state-administered student financial aid available for the 2000-2001 academic year.

This year's report, the seventh compiled and published by the New York State Higher Education Services Corporation (HESC), offers information and statistics such as basic program information and expenditures, longitudinal indicators of student aid funding, and comparisons of student financial aid available in each of the 52 states and territories (Washington, D.C. and Puerto Rico included). The data and tables contained in the Report represent actual 2000-2001 academic year expenditure data (unless otherwise noted).

Federal funding of the Leveraging Educational Assistance Partnership (LEAP) Program (formerly known as the State Student Incentive Grant program), was increased for the 2000-2001 academic year, after being held constant for the 1998-99 and 1999-2000 academic years. Federal funding for this program rose from \$25 million in the 1998-99 and 1999-2000 academic years to \$40 million in the 2000-2001 academic year, a \$15 million or 60% increase. The LEAP program is a federal/state-matching program to assist states in providing need-based grant aid to students to attend postsecondary education institutions.



## Student Aid Highlights

- In the 2000-2001 academic year, the states awarded \$4.681 billion in need and non-need-based student grant aid to more than three million students, an increase of 14.5% in expenditures over the \$4.089 billion awarded in 1999-2000. Of the amount awarded, 76% was need-based grant aid to undergraduate and graduate students, while 24% of it was non-need-based grant aid to undergraduates and graduates. These percentages show a slight change from the 77% and 23% awarded, respectively, in 1999-2000.
- Funding for undergraduate need-based grant aid increased 12.4% in the 2000-2001 academic year, over 1999-2000. This increase is significantly higher than the 7.4% one-year increase from 1998-99 to 1999-2000.
- Of the \$3.5 billion in need-based grant aid available, 99% went to undergraduates; and, of the \$1.1 billion in non-need-based grant aid awarded, 96% was awarded to undergraduates.
- Five states reported five new need-based grant programs (four of them are for undergraduates only; one is for both undergraduate and graduate students). Four states reported five new non-need-based grant programs (three of them are for undergraduates only while two of them are for both undergraduate and graduate students). Eight states reported eleven new programs in the non-grant category. Nine of these are programs administered by the responding agency; two of them are programs administered by other state agencies or institutions.
- Six states (California, Illinois, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, and Minnesota) collectively awarded \$2.1 billion in undergraduate need-based grant aid, comprising 59% of the total awarded in this category.
- Over the past five years, state spending (in current dollars) on need and non-need-based grant aid to undergraduate and graduate/professional students has increased 59.59% (see Table Two). From 1999-2000 to 2000-2001, 82.7% of the states (43) reported an increase in these categories, while 11.5% (6) reported a decrease, and 5.8% (3) reported no change.


- Twenty-three states reported an increase in need-based grant aid to undergraduates of more than 10% over 1999-00. These states were Arkansas (+ \$5.88 million), California (+ \$92.13 million), Connecticut (+ \$7.36 million), Florida (+ \$21.30 million), Kentucky (+ \$5.21 million), Maine (+ \$1.60 million), Maryland (+ \$4.07 million), Massachusetts (+ \$12.00 million), Michigan (+ \$11.06 million), Missouri (+ \$3.96 million), Montana (+ \$0.21 million), New Mexico (+ \$1.72 million), North Carolina (+ \$8.20 million), Oklahoma (+ \$2.03 million), Oregon (+ \$1.82 million), Pennsylvania (+ \$44.83 million), Puerto Rico (+ \$6.23 million), South Carolina (+ \$5.90 million), Tennessee (+ \$7.92 million), Texas (+ \$12.57 million), Washington (+ \$14.07 million), West Virginia (+ \$2.08 million), and Wisconsin (+ \$19.13 million). Three states reported a decrease in funding of more than 10%. These states were Idaho (- \$0.13 million), North Dakota (- \$1.30 million), and Wyoming (- \$0.16 million; eliminated all need-based undergraduate funding). This compares to seventeen states reporting 10% or higher increases and four states reporting 10% or higher decreases in the prior year. Four states, Alaska, Georgia, South Dakota, and Wyoming, did not fund need-based undergraduate programs.
- Reporting agencies administered over \$726 million in other aid (e.g., loan forgiveness, work-study, special purpose scholarships - see Table Three). States also reported awarding more than \$525 million in aid awarded by State agencies other than the primary student aid agency for the state. State designated federal student loan guaranty agencies also guaranteed \$25.9 billion in new federal loan volume – see Table Five.
- Table Six provides information on student aid programs with a merit eligibility requirement. Twenty-two states identified need-based state grant programs with a merit component. These merit programs constitute 37% of the total merit aid in 2000-2001. Twenty-eight states identified non-need-based state grant programs with a merit component. These merit-only programs constitute 46% of the total merit aid available in 2000-2001. Thirty-one states identified non-grant programs with a merit component (e.g., loan forgiveness, work-study, special purpose scholarships, etc.) that are administered by the responding agency. These non-grant merit programs constitute 17% of the total merit aid available in 2000-2001.
- In total, through state grant and non-grant programs, responding agencies awarded \$1.677 billion through programs containing a merit component. This compares to \$3.734 billion awarded through grant and non-grant programs with no merit component.
- Looking ahead to next year's report, states reported an estimated \$5.152 billion in appropriations for need and non-need based student grants and scholarships for the 2001-2002 academic year.
- Corrections to 31<sup>st</sup> Annual Survey Report:  
 Table One, Total Grant Aid Awarded by State Grant Programs, 1999-2000:
  - Texas incorrectly reported the amount in the Need-Based Undergraduate Aid column as \$154.424 million. The correct amount in this category is \$93.814. This correction results in a change in the overall total for Texas to \$100.568 million from \$161.178 million, a change in the need-based undergraduate Grand Total for all states to \$3,136.353 million from \$3,196.963 and a change in the overall Grand Total for all states from \$4,150.039 to \$4,089.429. This change also results in revised figures for Texas in Tables Two, Four, Eleven, Twelve, Thirteen, Fourteen, and Fifteen.
  - The amount listed for Washington in the Non-Need-Based Undergraduate Aid column was transposed incorrectly by the report producers as \$4.706 million when it should be \$4.076 million. This change does not affect any totals in the table.


# Need-Based Undergraduate Grant Aid by State 2000-2001

**2000-2001**




**Chart Two**

**Expenditures**



This scholarship has been established to honor the Seton Hall student who is credited with saving lives and helping many students avoid serious injury during the tragic fire on January 19, 2001.

### **New Mexico**

- *Childcare Grant* (need-based undergraduate/graduate). This program is being phasing out.

### **Ohio**

A statewide Consultation has been empannelled to study the impact of current State financial aid investments on college access and success. It is our hope that the Consultation on Financial Aid and College Costs will develop a set of recommendations in time for the next biennial budget deliberations.
